What is Organics Recycling?

Organics recycling is separating organic waste (food waste, paper napkins, etc.) from the trash and keep it out of the landfill. It gets taken to a compost facility where, after 6-9 months, it becomes usable compost that returns the nutrients from the food back to the earth. Organics recycling is also cheaper to dispose of than trash, and it lowers greenhouse gas emissions from landfills! With the assistance of grant funds from the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, organics recycling will be available in Becker County this September.

How to collect food scraps and compostables at home

- · Line container with BPI certified compostable bag (1 roll provided in free kit) or a brown paper bag
- Collect food scraps and other compostable items in container (more details of what is accepted on back)
- · Switch out bag once a week, or as soon as you notice the bag starting to break down
- Put bag in another container/bucket to prevent leaking and aid in transport
- · Bring to a County drop site near you

Drop off your compostables at a County recycling drop site near you!
