Black Chokeberry

Aronia melanocarpa



- **Plant Characteristics**: This is a long lived strongly arching and multi-stemmed shrub. Forms large colonies and spreads. Member of the rose family
- Size: Height: 3 ft. to 8 ft.

Width: 8 ft.

- Foliage: Leaves are lustrous dark green above with dark glands on the midrib. The lower surface is light green. Fall color wine red
- Flower: Whitish pink flowers borne in loose clusters of up to 8. Flowers open in mid-May and are 2" wide.
- Fruit:: Purplish black, 1/3 to 1/2" diameter, persistent into the winter.
- Soil: Prefers moist, well drained, acidic soils with average rich quality.

- **Tolerances:** Tolerant to drought, mine spoils, alkaline soils, soil compaction, pollution, insect and disease and salt.
- USDA Hardiness; zone 3-8
- Light Range: Full Sun to part shade
- **pH:** 5.0–6.5 pH

Other:

- Fibrous root system does a good job holding
- Songbirds and upland game birds enjoy the astringent taste of fruit in winter.
- Good shrub for wetland reclamation
- Used for windbreaks and wildlife cover.
- Excellent soil gripping capacity, rapid establishment, fall foliage colors and winter
