

 Plant Characteristics: Upright-oval growth habit in youth, becoming upright rounded with age and usually quite dense in foliage. Large shade tree. Native to Eastern United States and southern Canada.

Size: Height: 60–75 '

Width: 40-60'

• Foliage: Medium to dark green, 3—6'" long and across, 3 to 5 lobed.

- <u>Flower</u>: light yellow-green, small clusters developing before foliage in April.
- Fruit:: Samara, two-winged horseshoe-shaped about 1 inch long, appearing in clusters.
- <u>Soil:</u> Prefers well-drained, moderately moist, fertile soil. Does not perform well in tight compacted soils.

• Tolerances:: Tolerates shade.

• USDA Hardiness: Zone 4

<u>Light Range:</u> Sun, shade tolerant in youth.

- **pH Range:** No preference, slightly acid soil results in greater growth.
- Other: Slow, possibly medium growth rate.
 - Not tolerant of prolonged heat, excessive drought or thin soils.
 - Fall color often consists of a mixture of bright yellow, orange, and/or red.
 - Shallow root system.
