Soil Health Cost-Share Applications

- SHCS-23-02 GaHo, Windbreak Establishment Total project Cost \$3460.00 75% cost share, \$2595.00.

MASWCD Legislative Agenda

SWCD Aid Advocacy

Bill proposes \$22 million to SWCDs from the General Fund as opposed to the Clean Water Fund as it has been for the last 3 biennium. The Governor has 12 million in his proposed budget to come from the general fund. The allocation formula proposed by MASWCD is 70% will be split equally, 20% based on private land, and 10% based on population.

Custom Seeding Agreement Review

- MCIT and County Attorney reviewed and approved the Custom Seeding Agreement.
- Landowner information section is similar to the State Cost Share Agreements.
- Multiple Contracts discussed, as long as each field is less than 40 acres
- No adjustments will be made to acreage meter readings

Motion (Schauer, Andresen) to approve the Custom Seeding Agreement with the addition of "Seed must come from a Certified Dealer". All in favor, motion carried.

Retail Seed Sales

Bryan presented a list of CRP mixes and their amount per acre. Agassiz Seed would be the wholesale provider and they see SWCDs sell seed with an average of 25-30% mark-up but we could set it at whatever the Board thinks is reasonable.

Motion (Schauer, Beck) to set seed rates at a 30% mark up from wholesale, rounded up to the nearest whole dollar amount. All in favor, motion carried.

2023 Financial Assistance Policy

Discussion how and when to add the Financial Assistance Policy to current application agreements.:

The Board reserves the right to deny financial assistance applications based on past performance or other circumstances not in the best interests of the District. When applicable, notice will be provided in writing to the landowner/occupier after previous situation causing difficulties.

Motion (Andresen, Schauer) to approve the Financial Assistance Policy as presented. All in favor, motion carried.
